

La Porte City Traffic Commission

The January meeting of the La Porte City Traffic Commission was held on January 7, 2020 in the conference room of the City Police Station. The following members were present:

The following items summarize the meeting:

1. The minutes of the December 3, 2019 meeting were approved. Motion by Ron McAtee and seconded by Andy Snyder.
2. It was reported Lake Shore Dr. had been officially changed to a one-way street (westbound) from Grangemouth Rd. to Craven Dr. as of November 26th.
3. The digital speed signs scheduled for installation on Waverly Road and Truesdell Ave. have yet to be installed. This is expected to take place in the spring.
4. Since Mike Frazee was not in attendance there was not an update available pertaining to the removal of one of the 2-15 minute parking signs on Jefferson Ave. in front of the former Temple News building. We will hold this to February.
5. Karyl reported she had not had further contact with the owners of the Kroger complex for the removal of the vegetation impeding the line of sight at the 3-way stop.
6. Karyl Feikes presented a detailed drawing from Nick Minich describing the plans for sidewalks at 10th & I St. from 10th St. to the High School parking lot on the east side of the road.
7. It was decided to request the Street Department trim the trees around an obstructed sign, on Monroe St, which directs people to the Civic Auditorium, rather than move the sign.
8. There was further discussion regarding the request from Robert O'Connell to turn the 100 block of Fox St. into a one-way street. Karyl indicated she would review the City Council meeting minutes to clarify his request and report back at the February meeting.
9. Ron McAtee requested the Commission review parking on Madison St. near Boston Middle School to determine if the restrictions were still applicable. Since the building is no longer being utilized as a school he felt the parking restrictions may be better served on the opposite side of the street. The members will review the area and report back at the February meeting.

There being no further business a motion to adjourn was made by Ron McAtee and seconded by Sarah Brown.

The next Traffic Commission will be held at 6:00 PM on Tuesday, February 4, 2020 in the conference room of the City Police Station.
